MIAL HONORS 2008 AWARD WINNERS

On June 14, 2008, the Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters (MIAL) recognized and celebrated Mississippi's stunning legacy of outstanding writers, artists, photographers, and musicians. The elegant, black tie awards banquet was held in the Grand Hall of the Mississippi Museum of Art. Master of Ceremonies was Mississippi State Senator John Horhn, noted for his abilities as a speaker, actor, and writer, and as a staunch supporter of the arts. The winners received cash awards as well as Mississippi made gifts, Banjo Moon fused glass plates, designed and executed by Mississippians Marianne Wynn, Billy Wynn, and Sean Guy.



This year's recipients were Margaret McMullan for When I Crossed No-Bob (Fiction); Joseph Crespino for In Search of Another Country: Mississippi and the Conservative Counterrevolution (Nonfiction); Angela Ball for Night Clerk at the Hotel of Both Worlds (Poetry); Albert Oppenheimer for *Ravenous* (Classical Musical Composition); Talbot Easton Selby for An Unconscious Reality

(Photography); and Carlyle Wolfe for The Little House (Visual Arts).

Upon the discretion of the MIAL Board of Governors, Lifetime Achievement and Special Achievement awards are occasionally bestowed. This year award-winning author Ellen Douglas (Josephine Haxton) of Jackson joined this prestigious group, receiving the 2008 Lifetime Achievement award. A three-time winner of the MIAL award in literature, Douglas has published novels The Rock Cried Out, Can't Quit You, Baby and A Lifetime Burning, among others. MIAL members are encouraged to make nominations to honor the artistic achievements of living Mississippians (current residents or former ones with continuing, significant ties to the state). Judges will consider only work shown, published, or performed in **2008**. Members may nominate more than one individual in any category. One page of comments may be included in support of nomination. Nominations should include place and date of birth. Please make additional copies of this form if needed.

Only MIAL members may nominate.

AWARD CATEGORIES:

VISUAL ARTS (painting, sculpture, drawing, print, graphic arts, etc.) Eligible are up to 15 pieces first publicly shown or published in 2008. Submit CD, slides, prints, or published work.

PHOTOGRAPHY (color, black and white, combination) Eligible are up to 15 photographs first publicly shown or published in 2008. Submit CD, slides, prints, or published work.

FICTION (novel, short story, etc.) Eligible is work first published in 2008. Submit author's name, publisher, title of publication, and date of publication.

NONFICTION (any literature that is not fictional) Eligible is work first published in 2008. Submit author's name, publisher, title of publication, and date of publication.

POETRY Eligible are up to 15 poems published individually for the first time in 2008, or a collection of at least 15 poems published in book form for the first time in 2008 (poems in the collection may have been first published earlier than 2008). Submit complete tear sheets or publication.

MUSIC COMPOSITION-Concert (song, opera, composition, instrumental music etc.) This award is for works first published or performed publicly in 2008. Submit evidence of initial performance or publication (book, CD, tape) in 2008.

MUSIC COMPOSITION-Popular (blues, country music, jazz, rock, etc.) Submit published scores or the commercial recording first released in 2008.

DEADLINE: Nominations must be postmarked on or before **January 15, 2009.** Attach the artist's representative work (slides, photographs, CD's, books, etc.). Please mail the nomination to the appropriate address according to the awards category entered.
