The 31st Annual Awards of the Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters (MIAL) were presented on June 5, 2010, at an evening banquet at the Mississippi Museum of Art in Jackson, Mississippi. William Ferris received the Lifetime Achievement Award for his life's work in the field of Southern Studies. A Special Achievement Award was presented for *The Passions of Walter Anderson: a Dramatic Celebration of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Artist*, a multimedia collaboration of Jimmyle Listenbee, Amanda Malloy, Kevin Malloy, Alex Mauney, Rhona Justice-Malloy, Jared Spears, and Michael Barnett.

Frederick Barthelme of Hattiesburg received the Fiction Award for his novel Waveland. Charles W. Eagles of Oxford accepted the Nonfiction Award for The Price of Defiance: James Meredith and the Integration of Ole Miss; and D.C. Berry of Oxford accepted the Poetry Award for Hamlet Off Stage. In the Visual Arts category, Charles Crossley of McComb won for Charles Crossley: Textures, Shapes, and Forms of Spirits. The Photography Award went to Michael Loyd Young of Missouri, Texas, for his book Blues, Booze, and BBQ.

In the Musical Composition Awards, Caroline Herring of Decatur, Georgia, won the Contemporary/Popular category for her CD *Golden Apples of the Sun*; and Shandy Phillips of Arlington, Massachusetts won the Classical/Concert category for "Sonata Number 2 for Violin and Piano."

MIAL President Mark Wiggs of Jackson presided at the Awards Ceremony, and Richard Howorth of Oxford, Mississippi, was the master of ceremonies. Each award winner received a monetary award and a Wolfe Bird, created by artist Elizabeth (Bebe) Wolfe of Wolfe Studio in Jackson, Mississippi.

Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters Award Nomination

MIAL members are encouraged to make nominations to honor the artistic achievements of living Mississippians (current residents or former ones with continuing, significant ties to the state). Judges will consider only work shown, published, or performed in **2010**. Members may nominate more than one individual in any category. One page of comments may be included in support of nomination. Nominations should include place and date of birth. Please make additional copies of this form if needed. **ONLY MIAL MEMBERS MAY NOMINATE.**

Award Categories:

- VISUAL ARTS (painting, sculpture, drawing, print, graphic arts, etc.) Eligible are up to 15 pieces first publicly shown or published in 2010. Submit CD, slides, prints, or published work.
- **PHOTOGRAPHY** (color, black and white, combination) Eligible are up to 15 photographs first publicly shown or published in 2010. Submit CD, slides, prints, or published work.
- **FICTION** (novel, short story collection, etc.) Eligible is work first published in 2010. Submit author's name, publisher, title of publication, and date of publication.
- **NONFICTION** (any literature that is not fictional) Eligible is work first published in 2010. Submit author's name, publisher, title of publication, and date of publication.
- **POETRY** Eligible are up to 15 poems published individually for the first time in 2010, or a collection of at least 15 poems published in book form for the first time in 2010 (poems in the collection may have been first published earlier than 2010). Submit complete tear sheets or publication.
- MUSIC COMPOSITION-CONCERT (song, opera, composition, instrumental music, etc.) This award is for works first
 published or performed publicly in 2010. Submit evidence of initial performance or publication (book, CD, tape, score) in 2010.
- **MUSIC COMPOSITION-POPULAR** (blues, country music, jazz, rock, etc.) Submit published scores or the commercial recording first released in 2010.

DEADLINE: Nominations must be postmarked on or before January 15, 2011. Attach the artist's representative work (slides, photographs, CD's, books, etc.). Please mail the nomination to the appropriate address according to the awards category entered.
